Parables invite us to reflect on everyday scenarios, and ask ourselves "Where am I in this story? In this well-known parable of a woman searching for her lost drachma, where can we each see ourselves?

- ♣ Perhaps as a human treasured loved one of God, feeling temporarily "lost' from His sight and love for some imagined reason? Take heart...we know that even when we feel lost, God "lights the lamp of His love even more brightly in searching for us" (v8) When have you sensed a moment of God's seeking for you?
- ♣ Perhaps we don't feel worth "searching for?" Take heart...look again at the care the woman takes in lighting a lamp, sweeping the house all to find her small lost coin. In the same way, we are each important to God, however "small, lost and hidden" we may feel. Perhaps reflect now on a moment when you have felt God's deep love for you as He finds you.
- ♣ Think about something you have searched frantically for and your joy when you have found it...Perhaps reflect on the "joy of sharing joy" in our own lives and the life of the church.

Such joy in God's message here - that we are all valued by Him simply because we are loved and valuable to Him. Nothing and no one is ever too ordinary for God.
